# Interactive Story Installation

at St Barnabas Library, 2 French Road, Leicester LE5 4AH

Installation of a new permanent children's story experience to the children's section at St Barnabas Library

# **Overview:**

Children are invited to climb inside **Mister Tootles Storychair** and be transported to a magical woodland, a snowy mountainside, a small island in the middle of a silver lake, a mystical library. Mister Tootles Storychair tells stories of magic, being lost and the triumph of an outsider with stories from eight local, national and international authors including Michael Morpurgo, Chris Wormell and JM Barrie.

The Storychair invites children to enter a secret, underground, woodland world. Once inside, the child will trigger a range of sound effects that will enhance their imaginative response. Children will be able to interact with parts of the chair and release a story from the roots of the Baobab tree. Children will be able to choose from a range of stories. There are secret doors hidden within and once opened will reveal a miniature world of the story and will trigger the chair to tell that story.



Manya Benenson - St Barnabas Library Artist in Residence, and originator of the Storychair explains further

"The Storychair emerged as a response to seeing large numbers of unaccompanied children - lost boys and girls - come into the library, particularly in school holidays, and stay for long periods of the day, without necessarily knowing what to do.

I realised that something that I had taken for granted in my own family, the part of every day when I snuggled up with a child in the same comfy chair and read them a story, probably wasn't available to many of the children.

I wanted to create something in the Library that would offer children this opportunity, whenever they wanted for as long or short a time as they wanted."

There will be a special event to launch the Story Chair on the 30th January, to coincide with National Storytelling Week. The Storychair will also have potential to have a life after the initial stories and could have a new set of stories recorded and tour to other venues around the city.

# Project aims and objectives:

- To create a multi-sensory experience of storytelling in the Library.
- To promote the value of listening to stories.
- To give children who may not be read to at home an opportunity to listen to stories in an immersive environment.
- To create a world that will enhance children's imagination.
- To instil confidence in others to come and read or tell stories in the Library.

Mister Tootles Storychair has been created as part of the Imaginative Spaces project a collaboration between The Spark and the Leicester Library Services, to bring stories to life and promote reading for pleasure. # Manya Benenson Mister Tootles' Kiss

What ever happened to the Lost Boys when they came back to the real world of grown ups? Mister Tootles finds comfort in the Library, surrounded by stories in the children's area, but what is his mysterious object he carries with him at all times and why doesn't he want anyone to see it?

#### Jayne Williams - The Night the Books Came to Life'

Jayne Williams is a Derby based writer who has been creating and sharing stories since the late 90's. She was a Writer on the first year of Artist in Residencies with The Spark Arts for Children and is delighted to be invited to contribute her story for Mr Tootles. *'The Night the Books Came to Life'* is about a boy and a girl, a brother and sister, who sneak into a library to see what happens when the lights go out.

#### Andy Reeves - The Feather, the Flight and the Flame

Andy has been writing for children and young people's theatre projects for over 20 years. Highlights have included 'The Last Balloon', 'Adventures in Dystopia' and youth theatre adaptations of 'Elektra', 'Macbeth' and 'Dr Faustus'. For 18 years Andy was Artistic Director of Speakeasy Theatre Company, bringing participatory arts projects to a huge range of young people and communities across the Midlands. Andy was The Spark artist in residence at Southfields Library in 2014-15 and St Matthews Library 2015-16. 'The Feather, the Flight and the Flame' is a new version of the famous Russian tale 'The Firebird'.





#### J M Barrie The Lost Boys

The adventures of the Lost boys and Peter Pan in the fantasy setting of Neverland. The boys dwell in an underground house, which they enter through trees with holes in the trunks. Tink tells the boys that Peter wants them to shoot the bird, and Tootles obediently shoots Wendy with an arrow. She falls to the ground, an arrow in her chest.

#### Peter Benenson - Ombjy-Bomgies

Peter wrote this story for Manya when she was 6 years old and sent it in instalments in the post over a year. A wild and whacky story of make-believe creatures hiding in the woods. Finding it and editing it for the Storychair took Manya straight back in time, she is very glad that she can share with others a story from her childhood and she knows her dad would be too.

#### **Chris Wormell - The Wild Girl**

Leicester City Council 'Our Best Book' nominee. Chris is an illustrator and author he has published some 14 illustrated books and acted as illustrator of others' work on at least 18 more. His books have won the Graphics Prize at the Bologna International Children's Book Fair and the New York Times Book Review Best Illustrated Children's Book Award.

#### **Michael Morpurgo - The Gentle Giant**

Former Children's Laureate. Author of War Horse, Private Peaceful, Kensuke's Kingdom

#### **Colin Thompson - How to Live Forever**

Writer and illustrator of children's books. He has had over 70 works published and also draws pictures for jigsaw puzzles. In 2004, Colin was awarded the Aurealis Award in the children's long fiction category for How to Live Forever.
