

Spark LIVE! has grown from the trusted and much-loved Spark Festival. That festival still continues - now every two years - making room for Spark LIVE! to have a lasting impact throughout the year.

Spark LIVE! is designed to make sure every child has the chance to experience the arts close to home, all year round.

The journey

From artists and children's imaginations and insights to LIVE performances and interactive workshops in libraries, schools and venues.

Spark LIVE! started with Les-tah to the Front, a live band experience co-designed with families in Leicester for children aged 0-5. A punk-inspired interactive show celebrated creativity, individuality, and the vibrancy of Leicester, with children being encouraged to express themselves through music, singing, identity, dance and performance.

In Spring 2025, Les-tah to the Front toured five libraries across Leicester: Beaumont Leys, St Barnabas, Highfields, Pork Pie and The Brite Centre. These libraries are more than just spaces they are trusted, welcoming places at the heart of their communities.

By bringing live theatre directly into these communities, The Spark helped remove barriers that can prevent children and families from engaging with the arts.

Nursery groups, Virtual School children and families involved in The Spark's early years programme also attended, showing how long standing relationships and a deep understanding of local needs can make a real difference.

Key outcomes

Inclusive and representative programming:

The performance was recognised for its inclusive casting and the visibility of underrepresented groups, contributing to a more reflective and welcoming cultural experience.

- It was incredible to see a Black woman in the show so important for representation.
- Accessible and affordable:

Hosting the event in a local library made it easier for families to attend, particularly those with additional needs. The low cost also removed financial barriers for many.

- It was very affordable. Two of my children have special needs, so it being at the local library where they were familiar meant we could access it.
- 3 High quality and professional:

Audience feedback consistently highlighted the high standard of performance, organisation and delivery.

4 Engaging, interactive, playful and educational:

Active play and participation through live music, movement and the inclusion made the performance engaging and accessible for a wide range of children.

Content was tailored to reflect the local context, particularly Leicester's cultural diversity, which helped build a strong sense of belonging and community pride.

Following the library tour, **Spark LIVE!** moved into two major Leicester venues for takeovers, creating a dynamic shift from library events to more immersive, largescale events still powered by children for other children, young people and their families to get involved with.

Leicester Children Takeover

Spark LIVE! at Riverside Festival

Spark LIVE! successfully joined the Riverside Festival on Sunday 8 June, contributing to a vibrant day of creativity and community, attended by an estimated 75,000 people. The event, themed Let's Talk About... Having Your Say!, offered a dynamic platform for children, young people and families to express themselves through the arts and creative conversations!

From 12-3pm, children and families engaged in a range of free drop-in workshops including visual art with Pasha Kincaid, weaving and braiding with Mita Solanky (Saintly Amok), and sound and listening activities led by Corey Mwamba, Morgan Stockton and Tia Chand-Corey from Open Play Early Years. These workshops encouraged open-ended play and creative exploration designed for babies and young children.

The day culminated in a powerful spoken word performance led by Coventry poet laureate John Bernard. This collaborative session brought together children, families, artists, students from Law and International Policy Making and Assistant City Mayor - Children and Young People, Elaine Pantling to talk about how creativity can build a collective identity towards a world in which childrens and families voices are heard.

Overall, Spark LIVE! created a meaningful space for children and young people to explore their creativity, be heard, and contribute to a shared community experience - leaving lasting memories and inspiring confidence in creative self-expression.
